How it all started!

This is how the SYDNEY GAZETTE AND NSW REGISTER announced the appointment and arrival of William and his family in August 1809.

His Majesty having been pleased to Appoint the Rev. Mr. Cowpar to be Assistant Chaplain to the Settlements in New South Wales, and that Gentleman having arrived from England, he will be stationed and do Duty at Sydney until further Orders:

By Command of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor James Finugans, Secretary.


The interesting thing about this announcement in the press, apart from the interesting spelling of 'Cowper', is that although the Colony was still under the administration of a 'rebel' government (Macquarie had not yet arrived and was not to take up his official duties until 1 January 1810) the 'business' of government continued — with official proclamations such as these regularly appearing in the press.

What's more the proclamation was still made in the King's name!



Mailing to family members

As reported above a mailing to family members was conducted as close as we could manage to the 199th anniversary of William's arrival in New South Wales on 24 August. We must place on record our thanks to family friends Harry Young (layout artist), Chris Burns (typographer and finished artist), the State Library of New South Wales (artworks and scanning) and Moderne Art Printing who combined, together with a group of committee members to write and produce the material.

Our English cousins

We're thrilled to report that a member of the Cowper family from the UK has commenced corresponding with the committee in relation to the forthcoming commemorations.

Keith Cowper, from Buckinghamshire has recently started to research members of his family who came to Australia about the time of the First World War. In so doing has discovered an uncle, George Henry Cowper, who died in Doonside (NSW) in 1972, aged 82; George was his father's half brother.

Imagine our surprise when in his first e-mail he casually mentions that he has in his possession a tin box containing "letters from William, daguerreotype photos of him, and letters from Lachlan Macquarie which go back a long way"

This item apparently came to him via the Mountford family. (By way of explanation Frederick George Mountford married *Edith Isabelle Cowper - William's great granddaughter*).

He learnt of our forthcoming family activities from our webpage and communicated with the committee immediately. He also has a wealth of information about *Sedgwick* and *Elizabeth Ann* (both of whom eventually settled back in England with their respective families) and he is now sharing it with us.

Subsequent e-mails have revealed that Keith also has invaluable information about members of the Field family (descendants of William's second daughter, Elizabeth Ann) and of their family home Wivenhoe in Herne Bay, Kent!

Keith was apparently great friends with *Elizabeth Eugenie Cowper-Field* (they retained the Cowper in their name in subsequent generations!).

He also has pictures of the "Goldfinch family wedding" when Philip Goldfinch married Mary Medora! (*William's great, great granddaughter*)

Keith has also told us in a recent e-mail that he thinks he has pictures of (or letters written by) *Sedgwick*, William's fifth son. Pictures and correspondence that has eluded the Australian family for years!

Naturally the author of William's biography, Peter Bolt, is fascinated by the prospect of getting his hands on the William Cowper and Lachlan Macquarie correspondence and is wondering what else may turn up!

Needless to say, now that Keith knows the importance of all this wonderful material to this generation of Aussie Cowpers he is searching furiously through his attic so we can have as much of his material as possible on record. Both for the celebration, and the book!

What's more - Keith and Angela are thinking about joining us in Australia for the celebrations in August 2009.

All of which goes to show that you never know what you have in the attic.

Database and family tree

The organising committee (the committee) for the Cowper200 celebration is seeking to collect a range of personal information from descendants of William Cowper, and his children. The information will be held in a database managed by a member of the committee and will be used to:
